18.5.ii. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM FOR FACULTY, STAFF, STUDENTS:

The College has established a Grievance Redressal Cell, as proposed by the University Grants Commission in New Delhi, to provide a system for resolving student issues, ensuring transparency in admissions, and preventing unfair practices, among other things. A Grievance Redressal System (GRS) is a method for receiving and acting on complaints or grievances submitted by stakeholders of institutions, allowing for faster resolution of any issues highlighted and more effective service delivery. The cell's function is to investigate and determine the merits of any complaints made by students. Harassment cases can also be investigated by the Grievance Cell. Anyone with a legitimate complaint may approach personnel of the department in person or in consultation with the officer in charge of the Grievance Redressal Cell. Grievances can also be sent to the officer in charge of the Student Grievance Cell by e- mail.

Objective

The Grievance Cell's major goal is to foster and maintain a positive and harmonious educational environment for students. A Grievance Cell should be established for the purpose of resolving complaints raised by College students, with the following Objectives:

- Encouraging students to communicate their issues / problems openly and honestly without fear of retaliation.
- Suggestion/complaint box is set up in front of the Administrative Block for students who wish to remain anonymous to write down their criticisms and suggestions for enhancing the College's academics and administration.
- To maintain the college's dignity by guaranteeing a conflict-free environment and developing positive student-student and student-teacher relationships.
- > To ensure that student issues are effectively addressed in a fair and impartial manner.
- In order to encourage College students to respect one another and to be patient when there is a problem.
- To advise all students to avoid inciting students against one another, teachers, or the College administration.
- Ragging of any kind is prohibited both within and outside the facility. Any ragging or disciplinary rule violations should be brought to the Principal's attention as soon as possible. Ragging complaints will be addressed in accordance with ragging policies.
- Complaints of woman harassment will be addressed by the appropriate branch in accordance with government norms.

<u>Scope</u>

Grievances received in writing or online mode from students concerning any of the following issues will be handled by the cell.

The cell will deal with Grievances received in writing from the students about any of the following matters:

- Academic Matters: Concerned with the timely distribution of duplicate mark sheets, transfer certificates, conduct certificates, or other examination-related issues.
- Financial matters: Dues include fees for various items from the library, hostels, and fee related to institutions etc.

Other Matters: Concerns about hygiene, food preparation, transportation availability, and teacher victimisation, among other things etc.

Function

- Complaint Boxes have been placed throughout the College campus for students who wish to remain anonymous to write down their grievances and suggestions for improving academics and administration.
- Students have the right to file a complaint.
- ➢ For any concerns of any kind, the individual concerned can personally approach any member of the Cell and send an email or make an application to the Cell Convener.
- > The cases will be attended promptly on receipt of grievances from the students.
- > All cases will be reviewed by the cell, and formal action will be taken in accordance with management policy.
- ➤ The cell will report to the authority on the cases it has handled and the number of pending cases, if any, that require higher authorities' instruction and assistance.

STUDENTS GRIEVANCE POLICY

A student grievance policy outlines the process for students to address complaints or concerns related to their educational experience. here is a general outline for a student grievance policy:

Purpose: Committed to developing and maintaining an effective, timely, fair and equitable grievance handling system for its students, which is easily accessible and offered to complainants at no charge.

Aim: The aim of these rules is

a) To develop a culture of understanding, addressing and providing quick redress to grievances and take steps to prevent recurrence of such incidents;

b) To set in place a grievance handling system that is student focused;

c) To ensure that grievances are resolved promptly, objectively and with sensitivity and in complete confidentiality;

d) To ensure that the views of each complainant and respondent are respected and that any party to a grievance is neither discriminated against nor victimized and;

e) To ensure that there is a consistent response to grievances.

Scope: These Regulations shall cover any kind of grievance that students of the SCADCET may face during their period in the college campus.

Types of grievance:

- 1. Academic Grievances: Assistance with resolving academic disputes, concerns about grading, and other issues related to coursework and examinations.
- 2. **Infrastructure Support**: Addressing concerns or inquiries regarding campus facilities such as classrooms, laboratories, libraries, and recreational areas.
- 3. Canteen and Hostel Services: Providing information and assistance regarding dining options, meal plans, accommodation facilities, and hostel amenities.
- 4. General Campus Facilities: Assistance with navigating campus services, reporting maintenance issues, and accessing resources such as transportation and parking facilities.
- 5. Feedback and Suggestions: Welcoming feedback, suggestions, and recommendations from students to continually improve our academic environment and campus facilities.

Grievance Procedure:

- 1. Filing a Grievance: Students should file a grievance, including the requirement to submit a written complaint detailing the nature of the grievance, parties involved, and any supporting documentation.
- 2. **Review Process:** The institution will review the grievance, including any investigation or fact-finding procedures that may be conducted.
- 3. **Decision Making:** Outline the process for making a decision on the grievance, including who will be involved in the decision-making process and the timeline for reaching a decision.
- 4. Appeals: Specify whether students have the right to appeal the decision and, if so, the procedure for filing an appeal.
- 5. **Confidentiality:** We ensure that the confidentiality of the grievance process is maintained to the extent possible, while also balancing the need for transparency and accountability.
- 6. **Support and Assistance:** Provide information on the resources available to students for support and assistance during the grievance process, such as counselling services or legal advice.

Non-Retaliation: Students will not be subject to retaliation for filing a grievance in good faith.

Policy Review: The grievance policy will be reviewed periodically and updated as needed to ensure its effectiveness.

This could include issues such as harassment, discrimination, mental health crises, or any other emergencies.
2	General Grievances or Academic	48 hours	Feedback regarding general grievances, academic concerns, or administrative issues that do not pose an immediate threat but still require timely resolution.

Formation of Anti-ragging Committee:

Anti-ragging committee is a body at institutional level to establish measures for prohibiting, preventing and banning activities of Ragging Menace within and outside the campus in accordance with AICTE/UGC Regulations, supreme court directives and state act, the committee is responsible for taking action against those found guilty of ragging and or abetting ragging, actively or passively or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging. The anti-ragging committee should keep updated on the happenings/events related to ragging in campus or off-campus within the hostels and other designated places in the premises.

Ragging is a criminal offense. Ragging is strictly prohibited by both State Govt. and Central Govt. Punishment for ragging will be as follows:

(i) Imprisonment up to three years and fine of Rs.50,000/-

(ii) Dismissal from the college

Objectives:

- To prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student.
- To monitor, direct and oversee the functions and performance of the Anti-Ragging Squads in prevention and curbing of ragging in the institution.

Responsibilities:

- To be vigilant at all hours all around the campus and other places vulnerable to incidents of and having the potential of, ragging and shall be empowered to inspect such places.
- To make surprise raids on hostels, and other places vulnerable to incidents and having the potential for ragging.
- To conduct an on-the-spot enquiry into any incident of ragging referred to it by the faculty or student or parent or guardian, as the case may be: and the enquiry report along with recommendations shall be submitted to the Head of the Institution for action.
- To ensure the display of posters on Institution and Department Notice Boards and other prominent designated places.
- To offer services of counselling and create awareness to the students.

THE ROLE OF THE COORDINATOR

The role of the coordinator of the IQAC is crucial in ensuring the effective functioning of all the members.
